
shelter to prehistoric man from about 30,000 years ago to the end of the Stone Age, provided first-hand experience of Stone Age habitat to the participants.



The report on excavations at Sarswati Udyan prepared by Prof. Vidula Jayaswal, was finalized and sent to press for printing.
