definitely interest the scholars, researchers and lovers of Indian Art and Culture. Year by year the institution is moving forward with its academic and research activities. The untiring efforts of members make variety of programmes a success. The Jñāna-Pravāha Committee members, especially Prof. Yugul Kishor Mishra and Prof. Anjan Chakraverty (Trustees) are our main source of encouragement. The Director offers heartfelt thanks to scholars from India and abroad for their ungrudging support and guidance. I hope that in future also the Institution will enjoy the support and encouragement from them to reach further heights.

The remarkable academic pursuit of Jñāna-Pravāha during the year was the excavation at Rajghat, Varanasi in joint collaboration with Archaeological Survey of India, New Delhi. A certificate course on *Archaeology and Ancient Varanasi* was conducted by Prof. Vidula Jayaswal at Vasanta College, Rajghat.

During the year, the Institution launched its Annual Felicitation programme to felicitate a scholar of international repute. This year Prof. B.N. Goswamy was felicitated under this feature.

Prof. Richard Schechner from USA availed of the facility of Scholar-in-Residence programme and stayed at Jñāna-Pravāha for his extensive research work on Ramalila of Ramnagar, Varanasi.

Inauguration of the academic session 2012-2013 was held with a seminar *Kashi ki Vigraha-Yatra* under the annual feature 'Radiance of Kashi'. On the same occasion Jñāna-Pravāha Research Journal No.XVI was released in the presence of eminent scholars like Dr. Murli Manohar Joshi, Prof. Rajeev Sangal and Prof. Kamlesh Datta Tripathi.

The national seminars Buddhism: Art and Philosophy, Yogavasishtha & Indian

Thought Tradition and Arthashastra-Upaveda were organized in collaboration with Central University of Tibetan Studies (Sarnath), Sahitya Academy (New Delhi) and Maharshi Sandipani Rashtriya Veda Vidya Pratishthan (Ujjain), respectively.

The Jñāna-Pravāha Museum (*Kalāmaṇḍapa*) underwent a major renovation. Besides painting, sculpture, terracotta, coins, decorative art items it is enriched with textile displaying Banaras, Kashmir, Bengal, Punjab and Gujarat examples. Similarly, Banaras Gallery exhibits Kashi culture and art. In the exhibition *The Body in Indian Art and Thought* held in Belgium, Jñāna-Pravāha marked its presence with display of some of its paintings.

The young trained musicians under the Jñāna-Pravāha Scholarship for Indian Classical Music, Kolkata are invited in music concerts all over the country.

The Jñāna-Pravāha, Mumbai arranged different programmes, like Certificate Courses, Workshops, Seminars, Public Lectures, etc. during the year.

Besides above important events, Jñāna-Pravāha promotes Indian Art and Culture through a Reference Library, Handicraft Atelier, Saṁskāra and Anuṣṭhāna Kendra, staging of Sanskrit Play, performance of Śrauta Yāga, Music Concerts, etc. The erstwhile annual music programme 'Gulab-Badi' was organized this year under the new name 'Vasantiki'. The Institution exclusively organizes Sanskrit Antyaksharis, Cultural Quizzes, Lectures, Workshops, Interactive Sessions, etc. to expand the young generation's cultural understanding. The Special and Memorial lectures regularly arranged by the Institution with the help of national and international scholars add a different flavour to Institution's academic activities.









# Prof. R. C. Sharma Chair for Art & Archeology




## Samskāra & Anusthāna Kendra

Jñāna-Pravāha is running a city unit *Saniskāra & Anuṣṭḥāna Kendra* at Meerghat, Varanasi, which aims at nourishing the glorious traditions of infusing *saniskāras* and discipline among the younger generation aspiring to become *purohitas*. This is executed in *Gurukula* tradition. The emphasis is laid on correct pronunciation and proper recitation of the Vedic hymns, performing of rites and

rituals along with ceremonies, knowledge of Jyotisa (Astrology) and good grasp of Sanskrit grammar. The duration of the course is three years. Prof. Sita Ram Shastri and Prof. Yugal Kishor Mishra share the major responsibility in the functioning of the Centre. Every year 10 new students are admitted after interview by panel of experts. All the passed out students are now into active service of the society and earning well for their livelihood.



# Kalāmaṇḍapa (Museum)

The Jñāna-Pravāha Museum (Kalāmaṇḍapa), houses Shri Suresh Neotia's personal collection of paintings and artefacts. It underwent a major renovation and expansion this year. Besides rare painting, sculpture, terracotta, coins and decorative art items, it is enriched with new wing of textiles displaying Banaras brocades, Kashmiri shawls, Baluchara sārīs, Kāñthā from Bengal, Pulkārī from Punjab, etc. and appended with a number of new objects like of silver representing Kashmir and Banaras handicrafts, musical instruments from Bengal and other regions of the country. Some outstanding exhibits include a huge Kalamkārī, a dated copperplate of King Harṣavardhana and an exceptional piece of textile 'Samit' from eastern India. The added attraction is the objects recovered from the c. 8th century BCE site of Ramnagar in Varanasi. The Banaras Gallery (a separate wing) exhibits the various aspects of Kāśī culture and art including fairs and festivals, historic architecture and mural paintings of the city.






#### **Exhibition in Belgium**


