



Scholar-in-Residence

The Scholar-in-Residence Programme was started by Jñāna-Pravāha with the aim to achieve new heights in the field of higher researches in diversified streams of Indological Studies. Senior and eminent scholars are approached and engaged for the purpose. Their long academic career and vast experience play major role in selecting and accomplishing research projects on untouched and unpublished subjects, which are published by the Institution on completion.

The Institution is happy to announce that under this scheme, three major projects are nearing completion, viz. *Wall Paintings in Mughal Monuments* by Dr. Asok Kumar Das, *Study of Motifs in Baluchar Silk Textiles* by Dr. Syamali Das and *India and Her Changing Self Perception* by Prof. P. K. Mukhopadhyaya. The research portion of all the three projects are completed and writing part is in progress. These will be published in book form after the manuscripts are received.

At present, the Director General of National Museum and Vice-Chancellor of National Museum Institute, New Delhi Dr. B. R. Mani is working on three-year project entitled *Documentation of Inscriptions of Kashi and Capacity Building of Recording, Decipherment and Publication of Epigraphs*.

Prof. R. C. Sharma Chair for Art & Archaeology

After completion of the excavations at Saraswati Uddyan, Pukka Mahal, Varanasi, in August 2016, the findings from the site were cleaned, marked and registered. Fragments of earthen wares, which are found in large quantities at the historical sites, were also retrieved in good amount from this site. Each of the shards was washed, numbered, and classified in to several distinct types. Similarly, cleaning, recoding and analysis of antiquities from the site has also been completed.

The report of the findings of excavations of Shooltankeshwar and Saraswati Uddyan is under preparation, and is proposed to be compiled in one volume.

The report on Mundeshwari, the project completed earlier (2015) was sent to press, and it is being finalized under the title - *Religious Landscape of Mundeshwari: The 'Oldest Living Temple'*.

The report of excavations at Ramnagar entitled - *Varanasi and Ganga: Geomorphological and Archaeological Investigations at Ramnagar* has finally been printed and was released at the occasion of Prof. R.C. Sharma Memorial Lecture on 1st August 2016.



Kalamandapa (Museum)

Established in 1999, *Kalamandapa*, the Museum of Jñāna-Pravāha was started with the collection of our Founder Chairman Late Suresh Neotia. It was slowly enriched down the years with more acquisitions from time to time and at present has a good collection of paintings, textiles, stone and clay sculptures, coins of almost every era right from the beginning, decorative art objects, copperplates and antiquities found from Ramnagar (surface findings). A separate *Kashi-vithika* (Banaras Gallery) was set up with the purpose of providing a glimpse of art and culture of this ancient city through photographs and objects. Musical instruments of India are exhibited in another independent gallery.

Reference Library

The Reference Library is equipped with more than 11,000 books on different aspects of Indological Studies, like Culture, Philosophy, Art, Architecture, Sculpture, History, Religion, Script, Inscriptions, Archaeology, Textile, Painting, Numismatics and allied subjects. Several rare manuscripts also form the part of collection. Besides, one separate section contains books on Sanskrit and Classical Literature while the other on various aspects of the ancient city Varanasi.

Shilpashala, the art and craft development and promotion wing of Jñāna-Pravāha was established with the aim to preserve and promote the traditional art and craft of Banaras which is on the verge of extinction. The artisans are encouraged to continue with the tradition and produce handicraft objects following the age-old traditional methods. Required facilities are provided for the purpose. The Atelier is progressing well under the supervision of Dr. Pramod Giri and producing objects in *ashtadhatu* (alloy of eight metals) and *repousse* work in copper and brass.
